The Family Challenged Client in the 21st Century - While there have always been "preferential adopters" or "families by design" who add to their family built by birth by adopting or fostering, the majority of those who consider adopting or fostering come to this decision through some version of being challenged in building a family "traditionally," and their routes are changing. "Expecting" by Adoption - It is no secret that there are complexities that are unique to families who are planning to raise children through adoption! While couples, singles or gay and lesbian partners who are in the midst of adopting are not biologically pregnant, they will potentially experience a psychological pregnancy that lasts for an uncertain period of time. Through the course of the adoption process adoptive parents may encounter a series of challenges that can affect them emotionally, psychologically, financially, physically and much more. Pat will explore these issues and offer ways to "Confront the Dragons"!

Growing as a Family - In this session Pat will cover some of the "big" issues important to all adoptive parents. This session will introduce the Shared Fate Theory of David Kirk and the Entitlement Theory of Jerome Smith. The importance of healthy attachment is a well-known topic in adoption and fostering. How does entitlement impact attachment relationships between parents and children? How do families deal with the cultural component in developing entitlement? Building a sense of entitlement as a "real" family between parent and child means acknowledging your motivations for adopting, coming to understand and embrace the differences and similarities between parenting by birth, by adoption and by fostering, learning to cope with society's (and extended family members') image of adoption as second-best family building and finding ways to create effective channels of communication between parent and child.
